#### **Community Corrections Program**

During fiscal year 2022, Community Corrections provided county programs a daily per diem for qualified offenders diverted from prison. On average 1,912 were invoiced monthly resulting in a disbursement of \$8,601,830.00. The monthly average of offenders invoiced was up by 142 per month from FY 2021, resulting in an increase of \$348,090.00 in disbursements.

Fiscal year 2022 represented a rebound from the impact of COVID-19 for staff and offenders in the State's community corrections programs. As noted in Fiscal year 2021, front-end diversions and institutional diversions remained below prior year averages.

#### **Medical Furlough Program**

Alabama Code § 14-14-4(i) - The commissioner shall report annually on the number of applications for medical furlough, the nature of the illnesses, diseases, and conditions of the applicants, the number of inmates granted and denied release, and the number of persons on medical furlough who have been returned to the custody of the department. The commissioner shall further report on the status of all inmates who meet the criteria for medical furlough as defined in Section 14-14-2 [definitions of permanently incapacitated and terminally ill]. This report shall include those individuals who have spent more than 30 calendar days within the prior 12 month time period in an infirmary or under direct medical supervision for the medical condition associated with the furlough request or its comorbidities.
